The Greatest Show

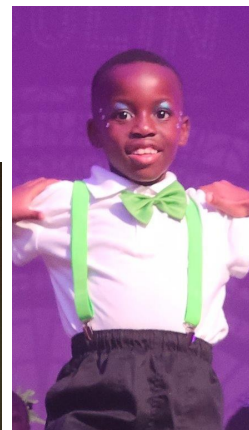
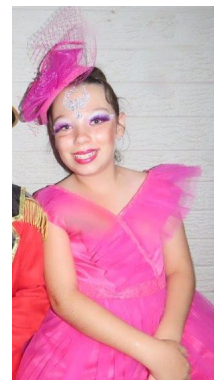
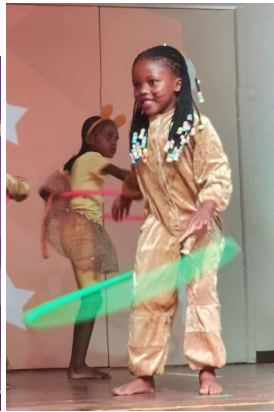
