Grade 6 Investigations: Photosynthesis

The Grade 6s have been exploring photosynthesis of plants in more detail and our first investigations all centred around plants storing the glucose they produce as starch in different parts of a plant itself. Our investigations started by testing both corn starch and glucose powder for their solubility. We then proved that we could identify the presence of starch in a substance using an iodine solution (iodine has a change of colour reaction in the presence of starch, which is a great visual for our young scientists) We then moved onto identifying what different foods contain starch using the same iodine solution. Some food reactions were obvious, for example bread and rice, whereas other such as potato and apple were to a lesser degree. Then there were some foods that didn't react at all for example meat and oil.

All in all it was a worthwhile investigation and the Grade 6s were reminded about the format of scientific investigations, and drawing conclusions based on their observations.



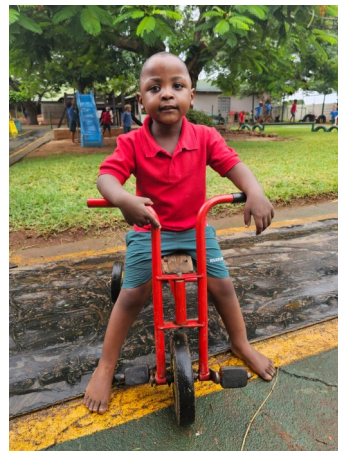


Pre-Primary News

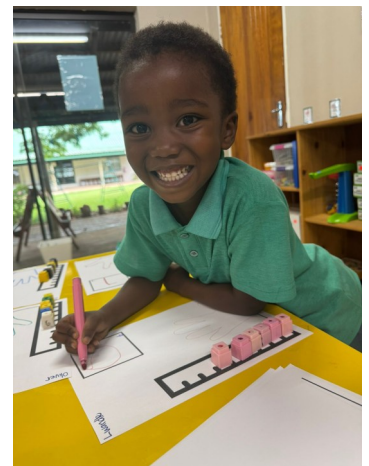

What are Global Soccer Schools International

Global Soccer Schools International are the largest network of soccer schools in South Africa. The coaching is unique, innovative and the most complete development programme of any sport worldwide. Global Soccer Schools International are often copied, but never replicated, and no one has ever come close to achieving the same results. The aim of Global Soccer Schools International is long term and ambitious: to change the game of football for the better and to make it more exciting and skillful by changing the manner in which young people are trained.

The Global Soccer Schools International syllabus covers every area of football. The coaching is by no means exclusively Brazilian however there are four key areas that have their origins in Brazil: Futebol de Salão* (FDS); Emphasis on Individual skills; Increased Training Time; Physical Training.

What is Futebol de Salao (FDS)

Futebol de Salão* (FDS) is a 5 aside version of football, originating in South America, that is played with a smaller (size 2) and heavier (645g) ball that has virtually no bounce (10%).

The game became very popular in Brazil with players such as Pele, Rivelino, Zico right through to Juninho, Rivaldo and Ronaldo who were brought up first playing fds before moving on to conventional football.

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Skills Badge Challenge And 'TRIPLE P' Concept

The Skills Challenge is central to our training programme, helping players' measure progress, develop quick feet, control and confidence.

Combined with our 'Triple P Concept' of practice, patience and persistence it has value beyond football.

The First Step and Kick Start badges introduce our 'core moves' and juggling, challenging players to believe they can master the ball.

Improvement comes gradually through practice, patience and persistence, as does belief and confidence.

Once the First Step and Kick Start badges are completed players move on to our full programme. This includes turns, moves to beat a player, passing, balances, traps and floor to air moves. The current levels are from 1-5.

Each level demands greater speed and repetition developing the players' concentration and ball control as they work through the levels.

Players complete each badge at their own pace and gain confidence through achievement, encouraging them to attempt the next badge.
