### From the Head's Desk

"Grit" is something often discussed by teachers at education conferences. It appears to be a characteristic that many young children lack. Grit is based on an individual's passion, motivation, and determination to achieve a particular goal. Grit is what separates the best from those who are simply good.

Grit, self-control and ambition are more important in determining success than intellect. Grit, unlike innate intelligence or physical attributes, can be developed in everyone. One way to develop grit is for parents to provide their children with challenges to work through and overcome. Adversity and failure are crucial to a child's development. Children need to be pushed out of their comfort zones. They must do things they are not good at and even things they do not enjoy. Do not give them an excuse to give up, they have to work hard at becoming better. Do not try and solve a problem for your child, let them struggle and become frustrated. Do not let your anxiety prevent your child from taking a risk and growing.

The language and behavior that parent's model for kids will teach them how to deal with adversity. If you want your children to handle setbacks calmly and to become a model of determination, you need to practice this yourself. It is also important to praise your child's effort and not only their accomplishments. Doing your best against strong opposition has to be better than winning against poor competition!

As with all things in life, the best way for kids to learn grit is **from watching their parents.** One of the most satisfying aspects of teaching is watching a child put in the effort to overcome something difficult. (This is a major reason why schools arrange camps and excursions). It develops self-belief, confidence and a desire to never give up. With these attributes, a child (and adult) will always be successful.
